IDEAS INCREASE & DIVERSIFY EDUCATION ABROAD FOR U.S. STUDENTS



The IDEAS (Increase and Diversify Education Abroad for U.S. Students) Program seeks to expand higher education institutions' capacity to grow and diversify study abroad programs for U.S. students through the provision of grants and capacity building activities. Each year, the IDEAS Program awards grants of up to \$35,000 to competitively selected U.S. colleges and universities from across the United States. The program also offers U.S. colleges and universities opportunities to participate in a series of study abroad capacity building activities, both virtual and in-person, to help create, expand, and/or diversify their study abroad programs.

IDEAS GRANTS HIGHLIGHTS

From 2019 to 2022, IDEAS provided grants to **116** U.S. higher education institutions to help build and strengthen their capacity to send more – and more diverse — American students overseas to destinations across all world regions.

IDEAS PROGRAM INITIATIVES

IDEAS Program initiatives convey best practices, increase knowledge sharing and networking, and provide resources to the broader study abroad community. These free initiatives include webinars and workshops on relevant topics such as faculty-led study abroad and assessment.

In response to the global COVID-19 pandemic, the IDEAS Program is supporting the study abroad community through timely and relevant webinars ranging in theme from assessment and evaluation, to crisis intervention. These events bring together experts in risk mitigation, virtual exchange, and assessment to help institutions navigate the pandemic and prepare for a safe and ethical return to study abroad.

The 2021-2022 IDEAS Program Webinars reached over **2,800** study abroad professionals from over **1,079** colleges and universities in all 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.
