IDEAS Program

A program of the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, USA Study Abroad branch

Seeking to expand higher education institutions' capacity to grow and diversify study abroad programs for U.S. students

- Increase number of students studying abroad from underrepresented groups
- Increase the number of U.S. higher education institutions offering study abroad programs
- Expand study abroad to new overseas destinations, particularly those that are less common

2024 Grant Competition

- Approximately 35 grants of up to \$35,000
- Approximately 1 IDEAS consortium grant of up to \$50,000

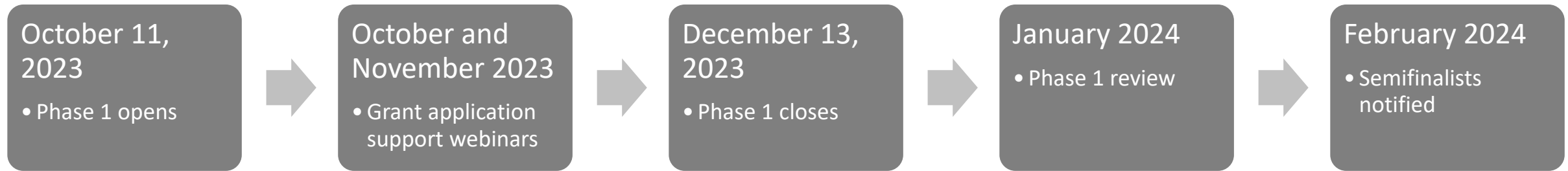

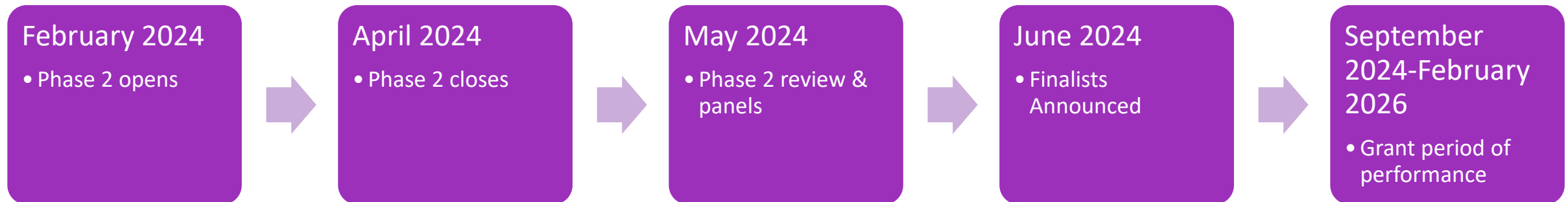

NDSU: IDEAS Grant in Action


- Supporting the expansion of study abroad programming for the sport management unit at NDSU
- IDEAS grant supports exploratory trip for faculty to South Africa and Tanzania
- Led to the creation of a faculty-led course and internship program to Cape Town, South Africa in Summer 2024
- Allowed us to explore multiple opportunities for study abroad programs in different locations



IDEAS Consortium Grant

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- University of Washington Tacoma, Green River College and Tacoma Community College applied to support Indigenous-identifying students at all 3 institutions
- Exploring Tribal Sovereignty and the Environment through an Indigenous Lens: identity-based, faculty-led study abroad program to Abbotsford, British Columbia in spring 2025
- IDEAS funding covers all staff/faculty costs (salary, exploratory travel, on-site travel, lodging, food, etc) to lower cost of program to students
- The generous IDEAS grant timeline has allowed us to confirm this program very early, meaning we can start program marketing and student advising earlier than typically possible

SPRING 2025
Exploring Tribal Sovereignty and the Environment through an Indigenous Lens in British Columbia

Green River College, Tacoma Community College and UW Tacoma are developing a study abroad program for spring 2025 entitled "Exploring Tribal Sovereignty and the Environment through an Indigenous Lens in British Columbia." Students will participate in on-campus coursework during spring quarter and then travel to Abbotsford, British Columbia at the end of the quarter to study similarities and differences between Washington State Coast Salish tribal communities and the Sto:lo people of British Columbia. While in British Columbia, participants will engage with faculty from the University of the Fraser Valley and local tribal knowledge holders. They will explore Sto:lo environmental knowledge and land management practices and learn how this critical wisdom can be mutually shared with the scientific community and policy-makers.

More information about this program, including cost, funding opportunities, course credits, and more, will be coming soon.

Diversifying and Expanding Global Learning Opportunities through Short-Term Study and Internship in Japan

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Need

- Large percentage of part-time students (75%)
- Majority of students pursuing CTE training and employment, not transfer (82.7%)
- 50% of student body receives need-based financial aid
- Existing study abroad programming lacks relevancy, is too expensive, and not available to part-time students

Activities

- 1) Develop short-term study abroad program in Japan to increase participation of part-time students and reduce overall costs for low-income students
- 2) Offer discipline-driven internship abroad to strengthen relevancy for CTE students, targeting Business related disciplines

Output / Outcomes

- Faculty travel to Japan
- Partnership with Internship in Japan
- Japan Study Abroad – 6 weeks in Tokyo (Summer 2024)
 - Pre-departure Orientation
 - Global Marketing Class
 - Business Work Experience
- Student Outreach - 400 students expressed initial interest for 42 slots

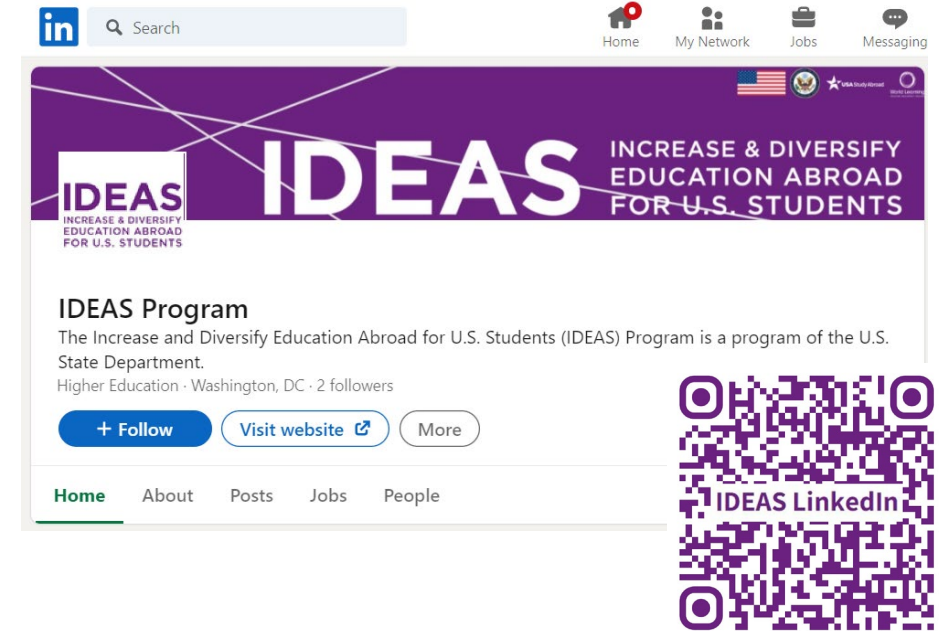
